Trial Site/Noise/Distractions

Plan and train for naturally occurring dog trial noises, such as printers, doors opening, crated dogs, lively conversation and laughter, possible barking and background music. Sound sensitive teams will not be accommodated, as each team must be judged in a similar environment. The general public has access to this site during the trial.

Reactivity: We are not able to change the environment for a specific dog, as the trial experience should be similar for all entrants. Expect 3 dogs in line for each of the trial rings, in addition to dogs exiting the ring in the staging area.

RIBBON AWARDS

A New Title rosette will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title.

A Rosette will be awarded to High in Trial winners Novice through Masters.

High in Trial

Eligibility/Rules:

- Entered in all elements offered for the same level (Interior & Exterior for each trial Saturday and Container & Buried for each trial on Sunday)
- Qualify in all runs for that level
- One High in Trial winner is chosen for each level (no separate High In Trial for the Novice A and Novice B sections)
- The High in Trial is determined by adding the team's faults across the elements. If there is a tie based on faults, then the team's times across the elements will be a combination of the least total time and faults.

High Combined

Eligibility/Rules:

- Entered in all elements offered for the same level (Container, Buried & Handler Discrimination for trial 1 Saturday and Interior, Exterior, & Handler Discrimination for trial 1 on Sunday)
- Qualify in all runs for that level
- One High Combined winner is chosen for each level (no separate High Combined for the Novice A and Novice B sections)
- The High Combined is determined by adding the team's faults across the elements. If there is a tie based on faults, then the team's times across the elements will be a combination of the least total time and faults.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Females in season may not participate, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from an injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance may not participate. No dog shall compete if it is sutured, bandaged, or has any visible wounds

ENTRY FEES

Scent Work Each Entry (includes a \$3.50 AKC recording fee) \$22.00 per Class pre-entry only

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check.

WAIT LIST INFORMATION - There will be NO wait list.

<u>Staging Area</u> will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area will include warm-up and waiting area, as well as the check-in and posting of running order and results tables.

The <u>Handler's Briefing</u> will take place in view of the search area prior to the start of each class, after the hide(s) have been set (if allowed by COVID-19 restrictions). In the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there's an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. NO DOGS are to be present during the Handler's Briefing. A demo dog will be used prior to each class.

A <u>warm-up area</u> will be available. Exhibitors should limit their warm-up to (2) two minutes or less. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the handler-dog team prior their run. The warm-up area is not for training or relieving of the dog. Please be considerate of your fellow exhibitors and do not allow your dog(s) to destroy the warm-up boxes

<u>SEARCH AREA AND RING CONDITIONS:</u> Search areas may be of any shape, and of the size specified in the Regulations for each class.

All exhibitors are responsible for understanding the rules and should obtain a copy of the Regulations for Scent Work Trials by downloading them from the American Kennel Club website.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. <u>Notification in writing, by a Veterinarian on their letterhead</u>, must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

Ringside: Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

Exhibitor Check in: We are operating a Self-Check-In system. Just pick up your armband upon arrival. Once the time and location for check-in is determined all exhibitors will be notified by email. Exhibitors MUST check-in EACH day they are entered. Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

The A/B Sections: The A class is for beginners. Those dogs who have earned a title in that element (in AKC or in another organization), and those handlers who have worked as professional detection dog handlers must enter the B section. The exhibitor is fully responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es)/divisions. Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of qualifying scores.

No entries will be accepted by phone, email, fax. Express mail entries must include the signature waiver allowing them to be left at the secretary's address. <u>Viewing</u>: There will be an area to watch the trial, if COVID-19 restrictions allow. If you are in the class, do not watch until after you have completed your run. No double handling. Do not bring dogs into the viewing area. Viewing is allowed for all runs where appropriate. Silence is requested when a dog is working.

STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BREIFING, AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

<u>Trial Site</u>. It is not appropriate to visit the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

<u>Possession of Odors and Training</u>. Chapter 5. Section 26 of the Scent Work Regulations state "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area".

Spectator Area. Spectators are encouraged and will be allowed if COVID-19 restrictions permit. Any person not handling a dog in the current class, or any person who has already completed their run in the class may choose to watch the search from the spectator area. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run except in the case of Handler Discrimination classes. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be asked to leave the area by the judge. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search with handlers who have not run.

<u>Crating space</u> if available indoors on rubber mat. <u>Indoor crating is restricted to committee members and trial</u> workers.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be inviolation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Kalamazoo Kennel Club and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Kalamazoo Kennel Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Kalamazoo Kennel Club or any official thereof.

<u>Collars, Leashes and Harnesses</u>. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical condition are not eligible for a refund.

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.

We understand exhibitors may have move ups. Please submit any move-ups by Wednesday, May 31, 2023.

<u>RIBBONS</u>: Please do not ask the secretary when the placement ribbons will be complete. They will be posted as soon as they are printed.

<u>SELF SERVICE LINEUP</u>: Please check in with the Gate Steward. There will staging areas with 3 spots for each search area. We are counting on exhibitors to keep these 3 spots FULL and ready to go for each ring <u>at all times!</u> If you are ready to run, go to the next open spot. You need not run in the number order on the ring board. Your number will be removed when you enter the search area.

<u>CONFLICTS</u>: We are aware that there will be may conflicts with 3 judges running dogs at the same time. On the other hand, be sure to start getting ready for your next run as soon as possible. Please help us to keep the spots full and inform the Ring Steward of possible conflicts.

<u>FOOD</u> – There is no concession at the trial. There are fast food restaurants within 5 miles of the Kalamazoo Kennel Club. Judges and trial workers will be fed by KKC.
